Trail Management Overview

Engagement & Community Outreach

2023-2024 Surveys and Meetings revealed key concerns:

- Litter, unleashed dogs and dog waste
- Speeding cyclists
- Lack of trail etiquette, such as not yielding or sharing paths
- Access/connectivity gaps, and trailhead parking issues
- Ongoing community forums and stakeholder input guide response strategies

Trail Systems & Community Use

- 25 miles of trails are maintained by the Town of Truckee.
- High-use corridors include Legacy Trail and Trout Creek Trail.
- Trails support a mix of pedestrians, cyclists, and alternative transportation users.

Education & Enforcement

Education Initiatives

- On-trail presence for pet education and safety
- School programs such as bike rodeos, helmet giveaways and safety classes
- Dispersion of free e-bike safety gear at Truckee Thursdays
- Updated the municipal code to create a 15MPH limit on our trails

Trail Maintenance & Enhancement

2025 Projects

- Paving & drainage contract to repave 4 miles of trail
- Crack repair by Facilities staff
- Trail Speed Limit Signs and Trail Centerlines installed (5 miles along Legacy Trail)

Trail Messaging & Safety Features

Trail Stencils deployed in 2024 to reinforce etiquette and safety:

- 27 on trail messaging locations with 9 locations in Spanish
- Collaborative effort with: North Tahoe Public Utilities District, South Lake Tahoe, Tahoe City Public Utilities District and Washoe County
